

## Background and purpose

In 1987 the Rotary Club of Livermore established the Rotarian Foundation of Livermore. The Rotary Club of Livermore Valley joined a few years later. As a public charity, it provides support to create opportunities for young people, promote community service, and improve the quality of life for the benefit of all in the Livermore Valley.

The Foundation's corpus as of December 31, 2018, was \$1,329,325. Thanks to contributions, fund-raisers, corporate sponsorships, bequests, and professionally managed investments for long-term sustainability, we will be able to continue our support to organizations serving our community into the future.

## Options for donors

There are many options for donors who wish to use The Rotarian Foundation of Livermore as a vehicle for charitable giving to our community.

- Cash contributions or other property
- Bequests
- Structured gifts, such as a Charitable Remainder Trust or a Charitable Lead Trust
- Designation of the Foundation as a beneficiary in a 401k or IRA account
- The gift of a life insurance policy to the Foundation

The Rotarian Foundation of Livermore is designated by IRS as a 501(c)(3) tax exempt organization and donations are tax deductible for federal income tax purposes to the extent allowed by law.

## Support to the community

The Foundation awarded \$1,233,328 from 1999 to 2019 in community grants, as well as purchasing a \$350,000 mobile health unit in 2007 which was operated by Valley Care Health System for a number of years. In 2019 the Foundation awarded \$44,000 for ten community organization grants and \$10,000 for Innovation in Education grants to fund high-impact projects for teachers in the Livermore Valley Joint Unified School District in a matching funds partnership with The Livermore Valley Education Foundation (LVEF).
